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New Educational Visits Coordinators and Headteacher Training

Critical Incident Management Training for Headteachers/EVC's/Managers

Visit Leader Training for NQT's and new staff

These introductory 1-day courses are compulsory for all NQTs/GTPs in East Riding schools and will be a useful induction for all new staff. Duke of Edinburgh Award – Bronze Expedition Supervisor Award (BESA)

This 2-day (non-residential) course is primarily for staff who help to train and supervise Duke of Edinburgh Award expedition groups. The course aims to share good practice, and to refresh and improve knowledge and skills. Participants should gain competence and confidence in navigation and group management skills. More experienced supervisors may also wish to attend as a refresher and to share ideas. The course might also interest other non DofE staff who would like to improve their own navigational and leadership skills.

Ski Visit Organiser

This is not the official Snowsport Course Organiser (SCO) Award, but the course has been designed for those staff wishing to organise and lead ski visits abroad, especially for the first time. The organisation and leadership of school ski visits is considerably more complex and demanding than many other school visits, and staff are recommended to undertake this training at an early stage of the planning process.

Creative Outdoor Learning Award (COLA)

The COLA course provides staff with the skills and knowledge to make the most of learning opportunities in the school grounds or local outdoor environments. The course covers activities such as shelterbuilding, fire lighting, cooking, gardening, pond dipping, orienteering, and problem solving. The award is recognised as a statement of competence only within the East Riding and is not as a national qualification.
